FROM THE MINISTER

Hello Everyone,

I've been thinking just how true the age old saying that "necessity is the mother of invention" really is.

In these 9 weeks (and counting) of lockdown there have been many such *birthings*, perhaps not exactly of 'inventions' as such but certainly new ways of doing things which have become firmly embedded into our lives. Top of the list for most of us is Zoom. Prior to lockdown the closest to such technology I was familiar with was Skype. Now, for most of us, Zoom is the choice 'go to' means of communication enabling us to speak as well as see friends and family, conduct business meetings or even hold church services. Of course to do so you have to be connected to the internet via a smart phone, tablet, laptop or desktop computer.

As I write this I've just come away from a very comforting meeting with folk at the 'virtual' Arches café. What an absolute joy to see so many dear faces I haven't been able to see since lockdown began. Thank you to everyone who helped 'birth' such a fine and caring initiative.

The other invention now firmly embedded in my life is media technology. Each week I have the occasion to relive a conversation I had some 18 months ago with the sales assistant at the shop where I'd gone to buy a replacement desktop computer.

He asked what I use my computer for – and wanted to know whether I was a 'gamer'. I vividly remember the look I shot him. One which I hoped conveyed my total ignorance about 'gaming' and its associated technology and indignation that he could imagine I would spend my time on such juvenile activities. Of course the only reason for his enquiry was that if I was a 'gamer' then I would need a computer with a larger processor to speed up streaming.

Each week as I have spent more hours than I care to recount uploading and downloading my video recordings for services I remember that conversation and regret my decision to disregard going in for as large a processor as I could have afforded. Because speed is vitally important to me now. Speed of broadband, processor, mega-capacity flashdrive, editing software programmes – these have become an integral part of my life in these days of media dependency for ministry!

And yet even as I suffer these 'birthing' pains I know I'm not alone in this. Many others too are suffering the steep learning curve of technology and all of it is made worthwhile for the reflection, richness and variety of online Christian services which have been such a source of comfort and guidance for many at this time. I particularly celebrate the fact that just within our circuit we have no less than 5 weekly online services, in addition to the many more from other local churches and further afield that altogether provide a real Christian presence and support so needed for these times. Admittedly that presence is slightly trickier to provide for those not on the internet and unable to access these services however within our church community we're fortunate to have volunteers willing and able to put service sheets through people's letterboxes or post them in the traditional way.

Indeed one of the vital reminders of this time is the recognition of our need to remain in community with each other and know we are together despite lockdown.

We have just celebrated Pentecost. Somehow I find something quite uncanny with how lockdown 2020 has coincided and run parallel with the Christian calendar at this time. The bleak period of Lent tied into the very bleak start of lockdown for which the reassuring message of Easter Resurrection acted as a real life-line. A retelling and reminder that our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ is truly alive and nothing can keep him locked away. As Jesus assures his followers - *'Because I live, you also will live.'* (John 14:19).

At Pentecost we have relived the arrival of the Gift from God breaking down the fear and isolation of those first believers and giving them the ability to communicate in language that could be heard by the many people around them. The power of communication with which they would share the good news of the love of Jesus for all and reach out to the world around them added to it the gift of boldness which no amount of persecution, imprisonment or martyrdom could stifle.

I pray that as his current followers the same gift will touch our lives and produce in us similar gifts for the times we live in so that we too can share

the message far and wide in relevant ways that enables the Good News to be seen in our lives and responses and heard in what we say. Because the world needs our voices and our witness today.

Let us hold all our community in prayer particularly any who are ill or in distress. Especially let us remember those who have recently lost precious family members, as we pray for all others who mourn the loss of loved ones. Wishing everyone a happy Pentecost may the Spirit be always with you! With love and best wishes *Felicity*

The burden of a benefit

In recent years there has been a great demand to enjoy the benefits of freedom, but this has not been matched by a willingness to shoulder the burdens of the responsible and often anxious exercise of freedom. We have heard a great deal about 'rights' of one kind or another, but very little about the demands that are correlative with every right, and have to be met if the rights are to be maintained.

The insights of founders

Their insights have been developed by disciples, and these few human beings have had an incalculable influence in forming the consciences of millions others. These have been the moral pioneers of the race, and their creativity remains unexhausted. p.138

The weight of demands, and how it is met

In the face of the demands of conscience and the obligations of commitment, human beings are often weak and unable to do what they recognise as their duty. What we call 'grace' is the experience of a gift that gives the strength to fulfil the demand. We experience something like grace in our ordinary human relationships - there is no mystery about it, beyond the mystery in all personal life. When a friend forgives, when a spouse encourages, when a child trusts - these are occasions of grace for the person so forgiven, encouraged or trusted. He or she receives something precious, and this in turn is something strengthening which enables the person concerned to give out something in return. p153

Regular walkers beside the Watercolour lakes nature reserve in Merstham will have shared my disappointments over the past few years when a pair of swans have made nests but failed to hatch any eggs. Then on Friday, May 29th, I was thrilled to see five cygnets swimming on the lake with their parents. The swans started building their nest, a platform of twigs and leaves at the edge of the lake, behind the fence next to the path, before the lockdown began. Richard and I have been walking past the nest once a week, hoping each time that it wouldn't have been abandoned as has happened in previous years. Every week, there was always a swan sitting there, seemingly undisturbed by spectators on the path. By last Tuesday, May 26th, I was wondering how long it takes for swan eggs to hatch. Do big eggs take longer than little ones? Were there still eggs under the swan? Were they viable? The weather was perfect for an early walk on Friday and this time we were rewarded by the sight of the new family on the water, three months on!
